


VEHICLE SERIAL NUMBER LOCATION

VEHICLE SERIAL NUMBER

All have vehicle's serial number on the left side of the chassis frame. The front four numbers are the manufacturing year of the vehicle, the other five numbers are the vehicle's serial number given by HDK Electric Vehicles. All the vehicles are documented. After the vehicles are sold out of the factory, HDK corporation will track the vehicles by using the vehicle's serial number as identity. Serial numbers are insurance warranty of HDK corporation. Customers should be aware of the importance of the vehicle's serial numbers.



VEHICLE VIN NUMBER (Only for street legal cart)

The VIN number, knows as Vehicle Identification Number, includes 17 digital alpha-numeric numbers. VIN number is only used for LSV cart (Low speed vehicle), VIN number plate is located on the driver side of the chassis frame, behind the driver side of front wheel, normally under the

ACCELERATOR PEDAL	Check the accelerator pedal ,when stepped and released it should returns to its original position with full flexibility.	
TIRES	Check the tires' pressure, pressure is around 20psi. Check tires surface, remove any embedded objects you can find. Be sure no cracks or other damages to the tires, defective tires may cause accident while driving.	
STEERING	Pull the steering wheel up and down ,check the tightness of steering wheel .Rotate the steering wheel right and left. Be sure no excessive free play and rattling sound .	
REVERSER WARNING BEEPER	Check the reverse beeper ,when the direction selecting switch be set at "REV", it should beep soundly	
LIGHTS	Check the signal lights , the brake lights and turning lights should be in proper working condition .


Check the tightness of the battery cables , make sure all the nuts are solidly tight. Loose nuts on the battery will cause big spark while operating.

ACCELERATOR PEDAL

The accelerator pedal is used to increase and maintain the speed of the vehicle. Apply slow and steady pressure to the accelerator pedal to start the motor and accelerate the vehicle. When you release the accelerator pedal the motor will decrease the speed of the vehicle.

A DANGER

Do not engage the accelerator pedal rudely, sudden or accidental accelerating can cause vehicle to suddenly move and cause severe

BRAKE PEDAL

The brake pedal is used to decrease speed or stop the vehicle.

It is the left pedal on the floorboard. HDK vehicles have two styles of brake system: Mechanical and Hydraulic brake.

MWARNING


When loading the cargo or towing a vehicle or trailer, the payload will be increasing the braking distance required to slow or stop the vehicle.

FOOT PARKING BRAKE PEDAL (MECHANICAL BRAKE)

The Foot Parking brake pedal is used to keep the vehicle in static on the ground or on the hills. Foot parking brake pedal is only used in mechanical brake system.



Make sure the parking brake pedal locks in place with positive click, and release freely when pressing accelerating pedal.

HAND PARKING BRAKE (HYDRAULIC BRAKE)


The Hand parking brake is used to keep the vehicle in static on the ground or on the hills. Hand parking brake is only used in hydraulic brake system.

△WARNING

Make sure the hand parking brake be pulled up enough to stop the vehicle parking on a slope and

NOTICE

Some vehicles with hydraulic braking do not have the hand parking brake lever, instead the vehicles will be equipped with motor brake which has the same function as hand parking brake.


MOTOR BRAKE (Optional)

Some vehicles are equipped with an motor brake which is used to park the vehicles automatically
When the vehicle stops on the flat ground or on the hills. The parking brake will be released when the vehicle is in F(Forward) or R (Reverse) position and engaging the accelerator pedal.

If you have a motor brake on your golf cart, make sure to unlock the motor brake mechanically before towing the golf cart, otherwise it will ruin the motor, rear differential and motor brake.

KEY SWITCH CONTROL


The key switch controls the vehicle's electrical system. The key switch has two positions : ON/OFF.

ON: When switched to "ON" position, all the electrical system and accessories can be used and operated.

OFF: When switched to "OFF" position, all the electrical systems are disabled.



THE KEY SWITCH CAN BE USED TO STOP THE VEHICLE IN AN EMERGENCY. DO NOT BREAK OFF KEY IN THE KEY SWITCH.





HIGH/LOW SPEED MODEL SELECTING SWITCH (Optional)

The High/Low speed mode selecting switch is located on the right side of key switch on the dash board.

- Selecting "H" mode will activate the cart to run at High max speed.
- Selecting "L" mode will activate the cart to run at low max speed.





FORWARD/NEUTRAL/REVERSE CONTROL (D/N/R Knob switch)

FORWARD (D):
When the knob is switched to "D" position, the cart will move forward direction when the driver presses the accelerating pedal with key switch on.

NEUTRAL (N):
When the knob is switched to "N" position, the cart will not move in when the driver presses the accelerating pedal with key switch on.

REVERSE (R):
When the knob is switched to "R" position, the cart will move reverse direction when the driver presses the accelerating pedal with key switch on. And will activate the reverse buzzer.



USB DRIVE PORT & USE CHARGER OUTLET


USB DRIVE PORT:

The USB drive port is used for transiting the data from USB flash drive to touchscreen media.

USB CHARGER OUTLET:

- 5V 2.1A
- 5V 1A

The USB charger outlet is used for providing 5V power from the vehicles to charge small electrical gadgets, such as cell phone, iPad ... etc.

COMBINATION SWITCH CONTROL

The headlight and turning signal switch is located on the steering column under the steering wheel. The switch lever is located on the driver side.

FRONT HEADLIGHT CONTROL

Pushing the lever down will activate the front headlights.



TURNING SIGNAL LIGHTS CONTROL

Pushing the lever up will activate the right turning lights, including front and rear turning lights





MOTOR BRAKE RELEASE SWITCH (Electrical)

(Optional)--Old Type (Optional)
The motor brake releasing switch is located under the front seat cushion, on the passenger side.
You can lift up the front seat cushion and find the switch. See image on the right. The switch is used for releasing the motor brake

manually when the vehicle needs to be towed by trailer or pushed by people.

Press down the switch to release the motor brake.

Press up the switch to activate the motor brake.




MOTOR BRAKE RELEASE SCREWS (Mechanical) --Old Type (Optional)

Use the Allen wrench (M5) to tighten 2pc small hexagonal socket head screws located on the left end face of AC motor, then it will disable the Electromagnetic Brake (EM-Brake) function, and release EM-brake disc. Then the vehicles can be towed or pushed freely.



MOTOR BRAKE RELEASE LEVER (Mechanical) --New Type(Optional)

For new type motor brake releasing lever, to to release the motor brake, press the plate on the motor brake mechanism and then pull the releasing lever to the right side on the image to release the motor brake, then the vehicle can be pushed or towed freely.














BATTERY

△ WARNING

Do not remove the battery pack cover. Do not attempt to remove batteries or battery cables. Do not use the battery pack without the control module installed. All battery and electrical service must be performed by an authorized service facility and personnel.

All tools used in or around the battery pack area should be insulated. Do not intentionally cause a short to the power terminal (B+, B-) with a metallic object.

Do not cut, tear or remove the seal tape. Do not disassemble or modify the design, including the electrical circuit, of the battery pack or control module.

To prevent the risk of battery explosion, keep all flammable materials, open flames or sparks away from the batteries. Do not leave the battery pack near a fire or heal source. Do not throw Lithium-Ion batteries into a fire. Do not apply heat to any part of the battery pack or battery management module with a soldering iron. Do not place the battery pack in a microwave oven, dryer or high-pressure container.

Do not attempt to operate the vehicle or charge the battery pack at temperatures above

Do not immerse or throw the battery pack in water. Do not pressure wash the battery pack.

Do not puncture the battery pack or control module. Do not strike the battery pack with a hammer or heavy weight. Do not step or stand on the battery pack. Do not throw or drop the battery pack on hard surfaces.

If the battery pack terminals are contaminated or dirty, clean them with a dry cloth before using the battery pack.

Keep the battery pack and control module away from static electricity.







LEAD ACID BATTERY OVERVIEW

Batteries loaded on HDK vehicles ,according to different configurations, customers who purchase HDK vehicles can have two different batteries options: Trojan T875 (8V)/T105(6V), and HDK lithium battery, which has the four models normally: L4860, L48110, L48130, L48165.

I. Lead acid battery (Trojan)



BATTERY MAINTAINANCE

Watering the batteries (For lead acid battery only)

Deep-cycle ooded/wet batteries need to be watered periodically. The frequency depends on battery usage, charging and operating temperature. Check new batteries every few weeks to determine the watering frequency for your application. It is normal for batteries to need more watering as they age.

- 1. Use only distilled or deionized water. Tap water can contain contaminants that will damage the battery. Also, be aware that water can pick up impurities from containers, piping
- 2. Fully charge the batteries prior to adding water. Only add water to discharged or partially charged batteries if the plates are exposed. In this case, add just enough water to cover the plates and then charge the batteries. Once completed, continue with the watering procedure
- 3. Check the electrolyte levels by removing the vent caps and placing them upside down so that dirt does not accumulate on the underside of the cap.
- 4. If the electrolyte level is barely covering the plates, add distilled or deionized water to the proper level as illustrated. î After adding water, secure vent caps back onto batteries.

- 5. Place the DNR switch to N.
 - Use only commercially available automotive cleaners with a sponge or soft cloth for normal cleaning. A garden hose at normal residential water pressure is sufficient.
 - Use a commercially available aluminum cleaner paste and fine grade (No. 00) steel wool to remove oxidation or discoloration from aluminum.
 - Use non-abrasive wax products. Fertilizers, asphalt, creosote, paint, or chewing gum should be removed immediately to prevent possible stains
- The seats of the vehicle will last longer with proper cleaning. Use a solution of 10 $\!\%$ liquid soap and warm water applied with a soft cloth. Use a soft bristle brush to remove embedded dirt.
- Use mild soapy water and a micro-fiber cloth to clean the windshield to minimize the risk of scratching. Avoid using glass cleaners or paper towels as these increase the chances of scratching or scuffing the windshield.

PREPARATION BEFORE STORING THE VEHICLE


A HDK ELECTRIC VEHICLE gives you years of trouble-free service when properly maintained. Please follow the recommended long-term storage checklist. For more information on overall vehicle maintenance, consult the owner's manual.

TWO WEEKS PRIOR TO THE STORAGE

Perform the following procedure at least two weeks prior to long-term storage to ensure proper mixing of water and electrolyte. It takes approximately five charge cycles with a minimum of 10 EUs removed to properly mix the water with electrolyte . DO NOT water batteries immediately prior to storage. This will not provide sufficient charge time to mix the water with the electrolyte. Freezing can occur when batteries are stored in this condition.

For Lead-acid Battery:

Make sure the vehicle is plugged in and the proper electrolyte level is maintained throughout the entire storage period. Perform the following procedure at least two weeks prior to long-term storage to ensure proper mixing of water and electrolyte. It takes approximately five charge cycles with a minimum of 10 Eus removed to properly mix the water with electrolyte. DO NOT water batteries immediately prior to storage. This will not provide sufficient charge time to mix the water with the electrolyte. Freezing can occur when batteries are stored in this condition.



Make sure the vehicle battery is plugged in for charging throughout the entire storage period.













JOBS TO BE DONE PRIOR TO THE STORAGE

- >Put golf cart under shelter, keep the golf cart in dry and ventilated space.Optimal temperature $14^{\circ}F$ to $95^{\circ}F$ (-10 °C to $35^{\circ}C)$. Maximum storage temperature should not be higher than 122 °F (50°C). >Turn the key switch to the OFF position, remove the key and leave the forward/reverse switch
- in the NEUTRAL position during storage.
 >Power down all accessories.
- >Clean the battery packs, tops and terminals using a battery acid neutralizer (1 cup baking soda per 1 gallon water). Check, clean and treat battery terminal connections with a battery terminal protector spray.
- >If your vehicle is equipped with a Single Point Watering System(for golf carts with lead-acid battery), place the fill tube on top of the battery. This allows any water in the tube to drain back into the batteries.
- >Disconnect batteries per ensuring that the cables do not come into contact with a terminal (Disconnect the 48V Main power outlet cables from battery pack ,insulate the cable) .
- Connect Battery cables back to system, charge the battery to full state every 1-3 months to keep battery alive without damages caused by over-discharging.
- >Perform all semi-Annual Lubrications
- >Thoroughly clean the front and rear body ,seats ,battery compartment and underside of the vehicle. >DO NOT engage the park brakes , but secure the golf cart from rolling. Chock the
- wheels with wheel stopper or something similar . >Check Tire pressure and infate the tires to standard pressure level as values presented on tires
- Perform all semi-Annual Lubrications
- >Thoroughly clean the front and rear body ,seats ,battery compartment and underside of the vehicle.
- >DO NOT engage the park brakes , but secure the golf cart from rolling. Chock the wheels with wheel stopper or something similar .

RETURNING THE VEHICLE TO SERVICE FROM STORAGE

- 1. Fully charge the battery.
- 2. Set the Forward /Reverse control (DNR) to N.
- 3. Adjust the pressure in each tire to the recommended tire pressure.
- 4. Have a trained technician lubricate the vehicle.
- 5. Do a daily pre-operation safety checklist.
- 6. Do a vehicle performance inspection.

The following steps can help you to tow an HDK golf cart safely without any damage.

- Turn off key switch.
- Keep the Forward/Reverse switch in a neutral position.
- If you need to tow the golf cart for long distance ,remove the battery connections from battery pack terminals. This is done to ensure that the Rear axle /Motor/Controller/Batteries do not get damaged during the towing process
- ullet Move the golf cart at a slower speed (Optimally Between 5-15MPH)or the same speed that you would generally move it if it has power. Exceeding the speed limit can over-spin the motor and
- Pulling your golf cart faster than designed to go can over-spin the motor. Possible slinging the internal parts into pieces and ruining the motor.
- Unlock the parking brakes. If you have a EM brake on your golf cart motor, make sure unlock
 it mechanically before towing the golf cart.
